These minor details subtly reinforce that your home is well-maintained.

<b>4.</b>	<b>Odour Check</b>  Fresh air is essential. Open windows to air out your home before showings. If you smoke indoors, switch to smoking outside while your home is listed, and consider using ozone sprays to neutralize lingering odours without leaving a heavy scent behind. Pet owners should stay especially mindful—clean litter boxes regularly, vacuum often, and use carpet fresheners as needed. Buyers are quick to notice smells, so eliminating odours is key.
<b>5.</b>	<b>Plumbing and Fixtures</b>  Fixtures should sparkle. Check all faucets to ensure they turn easily, don't leak, and have good water pressure. Replacing washers or fixing drips is inexpensive but makes a strong impression.
